From the pastor:

Grace and peace to you! Thus St. Paul began most of his letters to the churches to encourage unity to a people who often felt divided. The Jewish people had been set apart by God all through the time of the Old Testament.

When Christ came He makes it quite clear that He is the Savior of both Jew and Gentile (all who weren't Jews). When most people (Gentiles) would meet one another their way of saying hello was to say "Grace!" The Jews would greet each other with "Peace!". St. Paul saying "grace and peace" unites them both as one people, one Church, the one Body of Christ.

Division comes naturally to us. The easiest thing to do is to find people that are like minded to ourselves and gravitate together into a group. We consider that unity but it sets us at odds with those who aren't part

of the group. Men and women. Children and grown-ups. Political perspectives. Organic vs. GMO. Role of sports and education. When and where and how we worship. There's an unending list of what divides. We're tempted to believe that our perspective is always right and that others really need to come to our way of thinking. It needs to be "my way". That's human nature: being curved in on ourselves.

This is why Jesus teaches us to pray "Thy will be done". We pray that God's will be done and we ask God to change our will that it would be made like His will. In the Small Catechism Luther teaches us what God's will is, very simply. The good and gracious will of God is done when He breaks and hinders the plans of our enemies and when He strengthens and keeps us in His Word and faith until we die. He describes our enemies as ones who don't want God's name to be holy among us nor do they want God's kingdom to come. He

even names the three-fold enemy: the devil, the world and our sinful nature. When we curve in on ourselves we're looking to an enemy to give us focus.

We have a Savior who unites us in His blood and draws our focus from within, from the things that consume us, and draws our eyes to Him, to the one in whom true unity is found. All of us have been washed by the blood of Christ, constantly dripping with the blood of the one who forgives us. Wet with His forgiveness, He gives us a new perspective to see one another as dearly beloved family members, united as brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ. Christ Jesus gives us patience to converse and endure with one another to overcome divisions. By the grace of God, the undeserved favor of our Lord, peace with God is made because of the blood of our Savior. Yes, grace and peace to you!
